Christmas at Sea Success

We thank our many supporters for the amazing turnout at our St. Nicholas Day open house and the wonderful Christmas boxes that you donated to our 2015 Christmas at Sea program.

Recent Port Activity

It may seem quiet around port these days, but looks can be deceiving. On one hand, we had four less vessels (27% decrease) visit at port in January and February; but on the other hand, the sum of tonnage that passed through the Port of Albany rose by 84%, compared with the same period last year.

The slowdown in ship visits is occurring worldwide as the industry continues to struggle with international crises, a strong United States dollar, and other global issues. Yet despite these issues, the Port of Albany expects a continued growth in tonnage.

Two building projects are underway to support the growth at Albany ports. General Electric (GE) is building a storage facility in the port terminal and the port has begun work on a Roll-On-Roll-Off (RO-RO) dock in the southern dock region. The RO-RO dock will accommodate larger and heavier GE equipment that is shipped through the New York State barge canal system.

Albany Maritime Ministry stands ready to welcome all seafarers and transportation workers who visit our ports.
